

Onboarding and initial assessment

Engagement and planning

- **CCC candidate starting conditions** assessed through the RACCC-30 and MM.
- **CBG** organises the matching process of candidates to appropriate CCC Coordinator considering CCC configuration, geographic or institutional similarities and priority domains.
- **CCC Coordinators** review the proposed matches.
- 4 assigned CCC candidates present their institutional context using the diagnostic tools and focus on domain specific results.
- CCC Coordinators provides feedback, identifies shared challenges and provides possible learning synergies.
- The session concludes with a preliminary discussion of expected outcomes for the on-site visit
